services offered in Vermont; and

WHEREAS, paralegals play a vital role in supporting the delivery of cost-

effective legal services in Vermont and throughout the United States, thereby assisting in providing more equal access to justice

within our legal system; and

WHEREAS, the Vermont Paralegal Organization (VPO) is a state-wide

volunteer-based non-profit organization dedicated to promoting

paralegal professionalism and leadership; and

WHEREAS, it is the purpose of the VPO to establish and maintain the highest

standards of conduct, education and integrity among paralegals in

Vermont; and

WHEREAS, each spring, the VPO sponsors a paralegal educational conference

to promote the growth, education and standards of the paralegal

profession in Vermont; and

WHEREAS, the observance of Paralegal Day provides an opportunity to

recognize paralegals across Vermont for their efforts to ensure that quality, efficient and affordable legal representation is provided in

Vermont.
